The Law Society of Nunavut's <u>Continuing Legal Education (CLE) policy</u> recognizes <u>language</u> training in any of Nunavut's official languages.

1 hour of official language training equals 1 CLE hour;

3 hours is the maximum number of recognized hours for official language training.
