## Walking in Two Worlds: Balancing Inuit Societal Values in Everyday Nunavut By Peter Lucassie Jr.

In this 75-minute session, learn about the foundation of Inuit worldview through the framework of Inuit Societal Values (ISV's). ISVs provide a philosophical, conceptual and practical set of social principles that reinforce "how to live a good life" as well as finding one's role within family and community as a communal culture. This session will present the 38 ISV's both visually and through conversations of the historical and defined meaning of the societal values, as have been told to Inuit youth, such as Peter, to shape one's behaviour, skills, roles and inclusion.

Through a presentation on the ISV's, participants will have an opportunity to explore the IQ principles that grounds the justice sector in Nunavut. As a group, you will be guided to discuss the practical application and implications of ISV's within the context of community and interpersonal relations, as well as professional considerations in Nunavut's legal system and working with clients.
